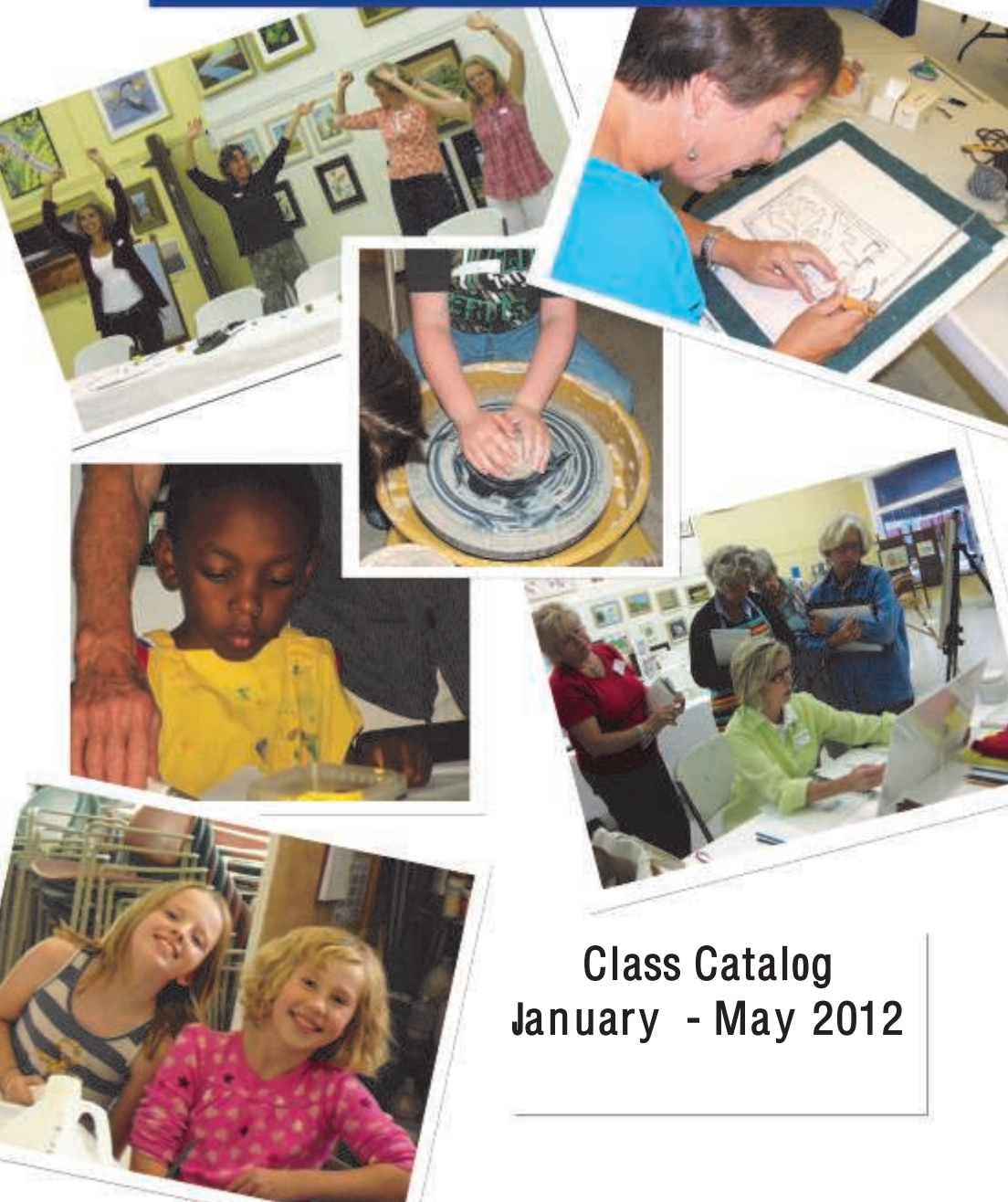

Registration Guidelines

PINE NEEDLE BASKETRY

Pine Needle art is one of the oldest crafts, dating back some 9,000 years. Seminole Indians were one of the first tribes to make pine needle baskets. During the Civil War, women made hats of pine needles. Pine Needle art is a "lost art" being revived today. You will learn about gathering and crafting this endless source of materials into baskets and vessels to be used and enjoyed. Please bring your own pair of sharp craft scissors. BEGINNING HANDBUILDING 0121

This introductory course is for beginning and intermediate students wanting to learn or practice the basics of working with clay to create sculptural and functional forms. No previous clay experience required. Students will learn the fundamental techniques of handbuilding with clay, drape molding, surface textures, extruded additions, as well as basic slip application, glazing and firing processes. Those with previous experience may explore the endless design possibilities for creating objects both functional and sculptural for the house and garden. Wednesday, Feb 8, 15, 22, 29; March 7, 14

7:00pm-9:30pm

In this six-week class, students will participate "hands-on" in the exciting process of raku firing where pots are taken from a red-hot kiln and placed in a combustible material for rapid reduction. Results are immediate and unpredictable. Hand building and wheel throwing instruction will be available, but emphasis is on the firing process. Students can expect to take home a finished piece each night. We will provide a bisqued pot for each student to glaze and fire the first night. And after that we will have the student pots bisqued and ready to be glazed and fired. *Students may bring their own tools but must purchase clay at class. Class will be held at Summer Haze Pottery, the home studio of the instructor.*

PICTURE SMOCKING 101

Thursday, Feb 16

10:00am – 1:00pm

This techniques class will concentrate on creating perfect picture smocking as we learn to stitch solid blocks of colored circles, squares, triangles and learn how to correctly work with several needles carrying colors across a design line. Basic smocking knowledge is required. **Class prep:** pre-pleat white 45x10 inch cotton insert for a large working sampler with 16 rows. Include as many ½ spaced rows as provided on your pleater. Bring the following to class: smocking needles, 3 colors of stranded floss (DMC), scissors, reading glasses, additional light (if needed) and an extension cord. Bring any smocking plates you wish to discuss. The instructor will have these items available to purchase if you give her advance notice.

Explore what many believe is America's one indigenous folk art. Rug hooking uses a hand hook, similar in shape to a crochet hook to form a looped pile from fabric strips on an even-weave base fabric. Create a design suitable for framing or turning into a pillow from the kit provided by the instructor. You'll learn to prepare wool, the techniques of hooking and how to finish your project. EMBROIDERY BASICS, PART 1

Saturday, March 24

10:00am – 4:00pm

In this one-day workshop, learn basic hand embroidery stitches, including straight stitch, chain stitch, couching, seeding, and French knots. The workshop begins with a brief overview of embroidery used in traditional garments and contemporary art. Students learn embroidery techniques using cotton fabric with an embroidery hoop and colorful thread, beginning with a 5" x 7" travel postcard consisting entirely of embroidery on fabric. This project can be designed and begun in the workshop and completed at home. The stitches that students learn may be used to embellish garments, handkerchiefs, pillows, or baby blankets. Examples of the different applications are shown during the workshop. HYPERTUFA

Saturday, June 16

Hypertufa (which is pronounced hyper-toofa) is the name for artificial stone. It is used to make a substance similar to the natural volcanic rock called Tufa. It is much lighter than stone or concrete and can withstand cold winter temperatures and blazing summer heat equally well. This mixture can also be molded and carved into any shape that you want. Over time, the hypertufa ages gracefully, collecting a patina of mosses and lichens. In this 3 hour make-and-take class you will learn to create a fire bowl to be used on your patio or deck. *Please bring a dust mask, rubber gloves and boards to transport your work. Pay materials fee to instructor on day of class.*

We will learn how to acid etch designs on glass. You will make bevel ornaments using your own design and stencils.
